

The melamine surfaces are the most resistant among the ones used in the furniture field. In case of persistent or dry stains, it is recommended to use pure or soaped water or alternatively ethylic alcohol and acetone as per following table:

Smooth or lightly embossed surfaces

It is suggested to avoid using of spray products directly on the surface as this can leave halos; it is preferred to apply the detergent on a soft damp cloth, clean and then rinse it. Avoid to use abrasive products, bleach or highly chlorate matters, acids.

Deep embossing surfaces

Clean initially with a soft cloth using solvents as suggested in the table.

In case of deep surfaces (such as Matrix, Orion, Nadir...) and very light colors, the preliminary cleaning operations can be inadequate to remove the dirty in the furrows of the deep surfaces.

In this case it is recommended to treat delicately the interested area with a melamine magic sponge, after having wetted it with tepid water and squeezed. Avoid to use high abrasive sponges, which could damage the surface.
